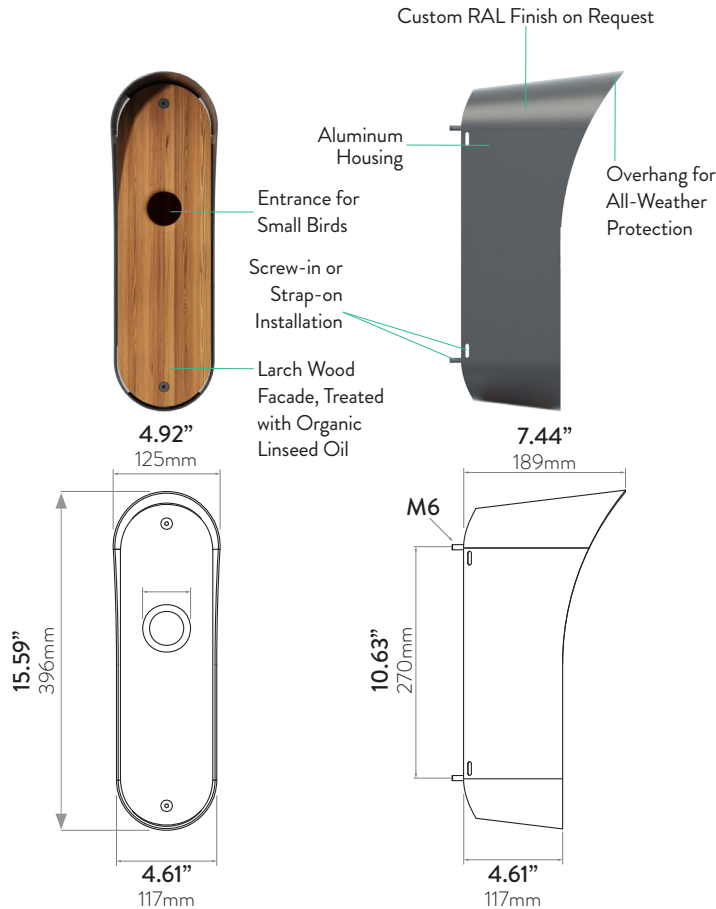


BIRDHOUSE

For Wall or Surface Mounting

Surface mounted birdhouse for wall or pole mounting accommodates small birds like chickadees or sparrows to encourage the development of biodiversity. Designed in collaboration with a wildlife conservation association, this birdhouse features an entrance hole small enough for birds to pass through while remaining safe from predators. Linseed oil treated wood facade provides a natural and sleek appearance, and features RAL painted aluminum housing with overhang for all-weather protection.

INSTALLATION

Placement: Ideal placement of the birdhouse is near a park, garden, or cluster of trees. Avoid areas that are too exposed to sunlight or shade. Avoid very noisy locations. Positioning away from light sources is also recommended.

Height: The birdhouse should be mounted 10 to 20 feet above the ground, out of reach of predators and humans.

Mounting: Install onto a sturdy pole or wall. Ensure the birdhouse is well anchored and stable. Avoid mounting to poles subject to frequent vibrations or movement.

Spacing: It is recommended to maintain 65 feet between each birdhouse. Close proximity could lead to aggressive behavior among neighbors.

Orientation: It is recommended to face the birdhouse east or southeast to avoid strong winds and overheating.

Signage: Consider installing informational signage to raise awareness about the importance of birdhouses and to encourage respect for these natural spaces.

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning: It is recommended to clean the birdhouse every autumn after the nesting period. Remove the old nest, carefully brush the interior, rinse with water, and let air dry. Do not use chemicals.

Maintenance: Do not apply paint or varnish to the birdhouse. Chemical substances are harmful to birds. Ensure the entrance hole remains clear.

MONITORING

Avoid intervention during the nesting season (spring/summer). Verify that the size and shape of the birdhouse is designed for local species. Adhere to all local ordinances that regulate the use of birdhouses and wildlife handling.

Your well maintained birdhouse is an ideal refuge for wild birds! Regular cleaning and maintenance encourages reoccupation each season.
